Create a special sensory bin using:

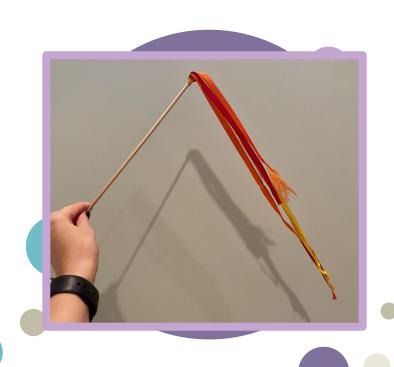
- Sand or Shredded Paper Glitter
