

Each week, our AOTH At Home content will revolve around a specific theme. This week's theme is **Springtime Blossoms!** As you and your little one enjoy the activities below, you can talk about your favorite things to do outside!

Spring Movement Game

Cut flowers out of construction paper or cardstock. Attach them to popsicle sticks. On each flower, write the name of a movement (i.e. jump, crawl, hop, run, skip, etc). Take turns 'picking' flowers to determine how you move and groove!

Flower Petal Color Sorting

Using colored construction paper, cut out various petal shapes. Mix all the petals up and have your little one sort out the petals by color, size, or shape.

Flower Petal Collage

Using found plants from your yard, glue them and other foliage onto paper to create a beautiful spring picture!

Sit and Sketch

Go and sit outside with your little one, give them sidewalk chalk and ask them to draw on the sidewalk what they see. Then ask them to tell you about their picture!
