About Arts on the Horizon:

Arts on the Horizon is a professional, non-profit theatre company with a unique and specific focus of providing performances and education programs for young people ages O to 6 years old.

We were the first theatre company in the country to focus our work solely on this age range. Arts on the Horizon values intelligent, innovative, and original work for very young audiences that is accessible, affordable, inspiring and joyful. We believe the arts play an important role in children's lives. The results can be seen in their development of critical thinking skills, self-confidence, and independence.

Each nonverbal production Arts on the Horizon commissions incorporates elements that connect to various child developmental milestones. Knowing that a young child's brain develops as they explore the world around them through sight, touch, and sound, Arts on the Horizon intentionally creates a sensory-rich environment with each production, utilizing vibrant imagery, music, sound effects, movement, and tactile moments where children are able to interact with the different objects used in the performance. Often, we incorporate repetitive physical movement in our storytelling, as new experiences repeated a number of times help children make connections, which shape the way they think, feel, behave, and learn now and in the future. Additionally, Arts on the Horizon's productions demonstrate and model the importance of cooperation and creativity, empathy among the characters, conflict resolution through teamwork, and the excitement of exploring new places and engaging in new activities.

Each arts education program includes creative drama exercises which focus on refining and developing fine and gross motor skills, expanding vocabulary and problem-solving skills, and serving as a catalyst for creative play outside of class. All classes and camps focus on creative expression; tactile, kinesthetic, and auditory learning skills; developmentally appropriate movement; and storytelling.

Whether your children attend a performance or take one of our classes, we are here to foster them in a safe, creative environment that promotes the positive. We're not in the business to produce better actors but to help nurture better human beings.

Elena Velasco (Creator, Director, and Sound Designer) Elena Velasco (she/ella) is a theatre artist whose work encompasses performance, production, education, and activism. During her career she has devoted her time equally between performance and residency work in the Washington, DC and Greater Boston regions. An member of Stage Directors associate and Choreographers Society (SDC), her directing and choreography credits include Central Square Theater, Convergence Theatre, GALA Hispanic Theatre, 1st Stage, NextStop Theatre, Synetic Theater, Adventure Theatre, Keegan Theatre, Imagination Stage, Mead Theatre Lab, Young Playwrights' Theater, Capital Fringe, Source Theatre, Discovery Theater, and Kennedy Center's New Visions New Voices Festival.

Ms. Velasco's artistry is driven by her commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion, and access, exemplified by her work as Artistic Director and Co founder of Convergence Theatre, a small, nomadic performance collective centered on social justice and grounded in consensus-organized processes. A dedicated educator, Ms. Velasco teaches and creates theatre through the lens of community engagement in higher ed, K-12 and bilingual creative youth programs. She currently serves as a board member for Educational Theatre Company, a committee member for AATE's Leaders of Color Institute and new chair of their Professional Theatre Network, and has been a featured speaker for Boston Conservatory at Berklee, George Mason University, Hollins University, Montgomery College, and TheatreWashington. Ms. Velasco is the production coordinator and an associate theatre professor at Bowie State University.


ARTISTIC TEAM (CONT.)


Diana Gonzalez-Ramirez (Actor 2)

Arts on the Horizon's 2022-23 season Emerging Artist Fellowship program is funded in part by an Aurand Harris Theatre Grant from the Children's Theatre Foundation of America.

Aurand Harris Grants and Fellowships are made possible through an endowment established by the late Aurand Harris and administered by the Childrens Theatre Foundation of America. Aurand Harris, one of this nation's most published and performed playwrights for children and youth, enormously enriched the literature of American children's theatre. Plays such as "Androcles and the Lion," translated into 10 languages, "The Arkansaw Bear." "The Toby Show." "Rags to Riches." and "To Ride a Blue Horse." are but a few of his plays that fill stages in this country and abroad. Harris's writings, informed by his studies in Kansas and at Northwestern University and by his teaching initially, in the Gary, IN school system, and subsequently, for over thirty years at Grace School in New York, have captured the spirit and interests of children for generations. Harris had a deep concern for artists, particularly playwrights, who devote their careers to creating quality theatre for young audiences, and for theatres who produce theatre for children. Through his foresight and generosity, the Childrens Theatre Foundation of America has been able to establish Aurand Harris Fellowships for artists serving young people and grants for small and mid-sized theatres throughout America. We congratulate Arts on the Horizon for being an Aurand Harris 2022- 2023 Grant recipient.
